Cultural and Linguistic Competency Requirements

California Assembly Bill 1195 On October 4, 2005, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed Assembly Bill 1195 (AB 1195) into law. AB 1195, "Continuing Education: Cultural and Linguistic Competency," goes into effect July 2006. The law mandates that the CME accrediting agencies (ACCME and IMQ/CMA) must develop standards for compliance. On and after July 1, 2006, all continuing medical education courses must contain curriculum that includes cultural and linguistic competency in the practice of medicine. California-based providers planning courses within the State of California must comply with this law. A copy of the entire AB 1195 is available at the CME Committee Coordinator's office (525.5351).
